NOTES: *The deduction for moving expenses for taxable years beginning after December 31, 2017 has been suspended for taxpayers other than members of the Armed Forces on active duty who move pursuant to a military order and incident to a permanent change of station.

^{**}In 2026, single beneficiaries with annual income over \$109,000 and married couples with income over \$218,000 as reported on your 2024 tax return will pay a higher percentage of the cost of Medicare Part B Coverage. The standard premium rate for 2026 is \$202.90 for new beneficiaries. Most people will pay the standard Part B premium amount. For additional premium rates see table at www.medicare.gov.

^{***}A modified test applies for the year an individual reaches full retirement age. One dollar in benefits will be withheld for every three dollars in earnings above the limit. The monthly limit is \$5,430 for 2026. The test applies to earnings for months prior to attaining full retirement age.
